Platform Highlights

Monteagle, TN 931-924-2286

MSSA has a long and rich history with the visual and creative arts. Visitors and residents anticipate the opportunity to learn and practice in a relaxed and supportive setting. The 138th Platform will feature several artists and their work through workshops and lectures. Registration for workshops does not begin until spring but here's an introduction to four of the artists who will have residencies this summer.

Aaron Sanders Head is a curator, writer and traveling, teaching artist based in Greensboro, Ala. In 2020, he will lead workshops from New York to Florida and New Orleans, with points in between. In week seven, Aaron will lecture on the history of Sashiko, the historic, traditional form of Japanese hand stitching. The oldest extant example of Sashiko is an 8th century robe of Emperor Shomu covered with a purple running stitch. Aaron will present a lecture on this ancient art and lead a two-part workshop teaching the application of Sashiko and hand stitching for decorative stitches and practical

Christi Teasley is an artist and educator living and working in Monteagle. She enjoyed summers at the Assembly throughout her childhood. After graduating from St. Andrew's-Sewanee School, she earned both a BFA and an MA in education from the Rhode Island School of Design. She will present two workshops during the season. In week six, students will create a mug rug as they learn the art and craft of primitive rug hooking. A two-day workshop in week four will teach students the oldest process of making felt from rolled wool, and the following day, use the material for their own works.

In week three, Judson Newbern will teach the John Gaddis Watercolor workshop. Judson has spent a lifetime pursuing artistic skills since he studied (continued on page 2)

watercolor at age 10 in the Outer Banks of North Carolina. After earning a bachelor's in environmental design from NC State University, he continued his studies at Harvard University where he earned a master's in landscape architecture. Susie Creagh Elder will teach youth art workshops in week seven that offer the Eagles and Eaglets the opportunity to express and create through painting and creating their own masterworks. Susie teaches at Harpeth Hall School in Nashville and exhibits her art with the Nashville Artist Collective. After graduation from the University of the South, she earned a master's degree in art education from Ohio State University. She has spent summers at the Assembly since she was a child.

ARC PROJECT SUBMISSION DEADLINES

Planning a renovation project? The Architectural Review Committee will accept projects for review and recommendation to the Board of Trust for approval four times per year. Questions about possible projects, the process, and necessary requirements should be referred to the General Manager. Projects submitted by the following dates will be reviewed and presented at the board meeting following the submission.

February 28 June 10 July 31 September 30 January 15

The ARC is available throughout the year to advise members on their project planning prior to submission of a request. Not sure if you need ARC approval? Check with the General Manager first.
