# Prayers



Dr. Reid Langford Ballenger, beloved husband, father, friend, and physician, died at home November 23, 2023, at the age of 92.

Born in Memphis on November 13, 1931, to Roy Langford Ballenger and Xalissa Harris Ballenger, he attended Pentecost Garrison School in Memphis, The Stony Brook School in New York, The Lawrenceville School and Culver Military Academy. He completed high school at Christian Brothers College in 1950, briefly attended Vanderbilt University but then enlisted in the United States Air Force, where he served four years as a security analyst during the Korean War, eventually becoming supervisor over the traffic analysis of the Kamchatka Peninsula.

Peter combined his undergraduate and medical studies at the University of Memphis, and the University of Tennessee College of Medicine. After a successful internship and residency, he specialized in obstetrics and gynecology and practiced medicine for 55 years and delivered thousands of babies in the Mid-

South. He was awarded the Gustav Adolph Michaelis Award from the University of Kiel in recognition of his service in introducing surgeons in Memphis to laparoscopy. He served as president of the Memphis and Shelby County OB/GYN Society, the Tennessee OB/GYN Society, and on the Medical Staff of Methodist Hospitals of Memphis. He served on the Board of Directors of Methodist Hospitals from 1983-1990, and as Chief of Staff from 1987-1990. During his tenure, he urged the Board to purchase the Germantown Community Hospital and expanded it to include a labor and delivery department. This became the Methodist LeBonheur Germantown Hospital. In 2006, Peter received the Living Award from the Methodist Health Care Foundation .Peter joined Memphis Obstetrics and Gynecological Association (MOGA) in 1999.

Peter was an associate professor with the University of Tennessee College of Medicine for over 35 years, teaching residents surgical procedures while performing surgery. He was one of the first doctors in Memphis to volunteer at Church Health, performed hundreds of surgeries free of charge during his 30 years of service

and he actively recruited other doctors to volunteer. He received the Jefferson Award in 2006 for his work with Church Health. He retired in 2018 at 87 years old.

Peter loved airplanes from a young age and was an instrumentrated pilot. He gave generously of his time and often flew pastors and missionaries to meetings and conferences around the country. He set two airplane speed record. He was also a skilled woodworker, making boxes, tables, and salmon boards and an avid golfer who hit a hole-in-one twice on Hole 16 at the Memphis Country Club. Peter loved animals and was a past president of the Memphis Humane Society and the Tennessee Humane Society, and a founder of the Animal Protection Association (later renamed Spay Memphis).

Peter enjoyed spending time with his family in the mountains of Tennessee at the Monteagle Sunday School Assembly, and he loved skiing in the mountains of Colorado. He was an avid fly fisherman and spent many weekends with friends and family at the Rockbridge Rainbow Trout & Game Ranch.

Peter was preceded in death by his parents and his sister, Janet Bond Ballenger. He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Barbara Maury Ballenger; his two daughters, Fontaine Maury Ballenger and Brooke Bond Ballenger of Memphis; and his nieces.
