# **Campus Master Planning Update**

We wanted to give you a quick update as we wrap up the Campus Master Planning process. Join us at the Town Hall on June 17 to see and discuss the plan. Judson Newbern, former planner at Vanderbilt University, provided us with the needed background on the goal of master planning and gave invaluable assistance as we shaped your ideas into a plan which will be shared this summer. Judson will join us at the Town Hall to answer any questions.

In short, the master plan provides a view of the use of existing properties and potential acquisitions in ways that support the mission of the Assembly in the future. The master plan does not address short term specific uses of property. Short-term use is in scope for the standing committees.

Based on this premise we took the ideas gathered in town halls and interviews and created "zoning" categories based on types of use (.e.g. Assembly operations, Community & Neighborhood, Recreation, Green Space) and then worked to identify a "zone" for each area of the original campus and acquired land. The plan will be in the form of a digital zoning map that standing committees can use to plan projects/use of our property.
