News from the Woman's Association Literary Guild

Attention all Woman's Association members! We have picked the books for this upcoming season's Book Club, and it's time to start reading! Please gather with us on the Winfield Porch to discuss these books.

Here are the dates of our meetings and book selections: June 26th <u>Here One Moment</u> by Lianne Moriarty. If you knew your future, would you try to fight fate? If you were told that you only had a certain amount of time left to live, would you do things differently? On an ordinary, short, flight, somet1hing extraordinary happens to the people on board. One passenger, a small, non-descript woman referred to later as "The Death Lady," tells each person how and when they will die. Liane Moriarity's Here One Moment is a brilliantly constructed story that looks at free will and destiny, grief and love, marriage and family, and the struggle to maintain control in our uncertain world. We could not put this book down! There is so much to discuss!

July 10th- <u>The Comfort of Crows:</u> <u>A Backyard Year</u> by Margaret Renkl. In her new book, Margaret Renkl presents a literary devotional: fifty-two short chapters that follow the creatures and plants in her backyard over the course of a year. What develops is a portrait of joy and grief: joy in the ongoing pleasures of the natural world, and grief over songbirds that are fewer and fewer. Beloved author Ann Patchett describes this book as "A howling love letter to the world." This book can be thought of as a prayer book centered on plants and animals. We think you will love this charming and enchanting book. Plus, the illustrations, done by Renkl's brother Billy, are beautiful.

July 24th- Be Ready When the Luck Happens by Ina Garten. This is Garten's long-awaited memoir. Also known as the Barefoot Contessa, she is the author of 13 cookbooks, a longtime Food Network personality, an Instagram sensation and a cultural icon. In her memoir, she shares an intimate. entertaining and inspiring account of her remarkable journey. This is a no-holds-barred account of Garten's personal challenges, adventures and unexpected career twists. We will meet on the porch of Linger Longer, #77, for this meeting and will enjoy delicious food (featuring all recipes by Garten, of course!!) and drinks. Happy reading!! Ash Trees and Emerald Ash Borer

This part of Tennessee is subject to the Emerald Ash Borer, an invasive beetle that tunnels into ash trees and disrupts their ability to move nutrients and water, ultimately leading to the death of the tree. It's time again for the Assembly's biennial treatment of the ash trees that grow in the common areas of the grounds. If you would like the ash trees on your leasehold treated, give the office a call or send an email to Julia

(julia.robinson@mssa1882.org). Each leasehold is responsible for the cost to treat the trees on their property. If you do not contact the office, your tree(s) will not be treated.
