Prayers

Melville Maslin Barnes, Jr., age 80, of Nashville, Tennessee,



passed away peacefully on September 18, 2024, in Monteagle, Tennessee. Mel was born in Nashville where he attended Parmer School and Julia Green Elementary, Battle Ground Academy, and Vanderbilt University, from which he received a bachelor's degree in 1966. Mel was a member of the Vanderbilt ROTC and served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War from 1967-1968.

As a First Lieutenant in the 5th Battalion, 27th Artillery, he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal in 1968 for "meritorious achievement in ground operations against hostile forces." In his role as Battalion Liaison Officer, "his expert knowledge of artillery procedures and ability to establish a fine rapport with his counterparts gained him the respect and admiration of all those with whom he served." Lieutenant Barnes's "personal conduct and conspicuous performance of duty" were said to be "in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service" and reflected "great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army."

Upon returning to Nashville, he began working with his father, Mel, Sr., as an investment banker at J.C. Bradford & Co. (later UBS), where he would remain for 49 years until his retirement in 2017. Mel served as the president of the Sierra Club – Tennessee Chapter. In 1972, alongside his mother Katherine, Mel organized and led the Bicentennial Reenactment of the Founding of Nashville, a nineweek flatboat trip on the Holston, Tennessee, Ohio, and Cumberland rivers into Fort Nashborough in downtown Nashville. Later, Mel was an avid tennis player, an active member of the Woodmont Kiwanis Club, and a lover of the Monteagle Sunday School Assembly. He was preceded in death by his parents, Melville M. Barnes, Sr. and Katherine Rolston Barnes, as well as his brother, Stevenson Fletcher Barnes (all of Nashville), and his brother-in-law, Art Malone, of Birmingham, Alabama. Mel is survived by his sister, Cornelia Barnes Malone, of Birmingham. He is also survived by his children, Katherine (Hilson) and Christopher (Phuong), and by his two grandchildren, Louise and Rolston, who were with him in Monteagle every summer of their lives and whose presence he adored above all others. A celebration of life will be held at Monteagle Sunday School Assembly Cemetery on October 26th at 3 p.m. with a reception to follow at Edgeworth Inn. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to Monteagle Sunday School Assembly, PO Box 307, Monteagle, TN 37356.
