1. The dates are September 26-30.

- 3. If you are loaning your cottage and will not be present, there is a \$125 security fee. It is up to you to pay or have your guests pay. Please let the office know who will be there.
- 4. Car passes are required \$5 per day or \$15 for the week. Members can use their season sticker or ask for a car pass.

QUICK BITES
